We use the base form of the verb and add -s for the third person singular.

Present simple: spelling

For most verbs we add -s to the base form to make the she, he, it (third person singular) form:

come → come s	order → order s	travel → travel s	
eat → eat s	record → record s	walk → walk s	
move → move s			

For other verbs, the spelling changes are:

When the verb ends in -ch, -ss, -sh, -x or -zz, we add -es.	wa sh	wash es

When the verb ends in a consonant + -y we change y to i and add -es.	stu dy	stud ies
	rep ly	repl ies
But when the verb ends in a vowel + -y we just add -s.	р ау	pay s
but when the verb ends in a vower 1 -y we just add -s.	enj oy	enjoy s
	have	ha s
Have, go, do and be are irregular.	go	go es
nave, go, ao ana be are megalar.	do	do es
	be	is

When the verb ends in -s or -z we double the -s or -z and add -es, e.g. quiz, quizzes. These verbs are not common.
